KNOX WOULDN'T TALK

Refuses to Have Anything to Say on the Cortelyou Letters.

Honolulu, Aug. 30. - Secretary Knox refused on his arrival today to make any comment on Theodore Roosevelt's denial that he ever had said in the presence of Mr. Knox that letters to George B. Cortelyou were written "to make good the record." The letters in question were instructions that any contributions made by the Standard Oil Company to the Republican campaign fund of 1904 must

e returned. "As I have made no statement conerning the correspondence between Mr. Roosevelt and Mr. Cortelyou on any subject," said Mr. Knox, "and I have never authorized any one to make any statement for me, you nust excuse me from discussing the ibject now."

Mr. Knox is voyaging by the cruiser Maryland to the funeral of the late Emperor of Japan, which he will atend as a representative of the United States. The Japanese consul was among those to greet him today. The Maryland will sail for Yokoama at 4 o'clock tomorrow morn-Returning with Secretary Knox mmediately after the funeral, the vessel will call here to pick up Secretary Fisher, of the department of the nterior, who is due to arrive here rom San Francisco in the meantime.


