



"It is realized," says this correspondent, "that time is on the side of the Entente powers, and the attack on the Dardanelles has caused all parties to recognize the fact that a change is at hand. It is believed a reconstruc-tion of the cabinet is impending, which will facilitate this change. The cabinets of Berlin and Vienna are becoming alarmed and desperate efforts are being made to compromise Bulgaria in the eyes of the Entente powers, by provoking hostilities between Bulgaria and Servia. But the Bulgarian Government is firmly resolved not to allow its hand to be forced."

Von Bulow Still At Work ROME, Via Paris, April 16 .- 11:35 p. m .- Frince Von Bulow, the German Ambassador to Italy, is indefatigable in his efforts to bring about an understanding diplomatically between Italy and Austria. His task is recognized here to be most difficult, yet those who have seen him lately declare that he seems to be more satisfied with the way things are going. From this and other indications it is being argued by close observers that Austria is slowly beginning to realize that her future existence may in large measure depend upon reaching some understanding with

Pleads With Austria.

Prince Von Bulow's course is believed to be just now devoted largely to conveying to Austria that to satisfy Italy is not a measure of the moment, but would be a far sighted step for the future, his argument being that a close Austro-Italian union would give the Triple Alliance new vigor, a wider scope and greater power.






