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HUNDREDS GATHER TO WATCH LAYING OF CORNER-STONE

Premier Drury Officials at Interesting Scene at Western University.

SEES FINE FUTURE

Drury Declares No Better Work Than Development of Educational Institutions.

More than a thousand keenly interested citizens turned out in gala attire to witness the laying of the cornerstones of the new University of Western Ontario by Premier Drury yesterday afternoon.

The event, perhaps the most significant of its kind ever enacted in this part of the province, left a marked impression on the crowds who gathered about the platform from which the premier and A. T. Little, chairman of the board of governors, spoke. The historic ceremony was held under a beating sun and the woodland beauty of the grounds made a tranquil and inspiring background for the occasion.

Women in colorful summer dresses and officers of the R. C. R. and headquarters staff in full dress uniform, lent a happy glow to the picturesque scene. Notables from all over Western Ontario, members of the university staff, clergy, civic officials, and persons prominent in educational life thronged the dais from which the addresses were delivered.

Premier Arrives. Premier Drury arrived at the university at 3:30. He was greeted by Lieut.-Col. Brown, executive secretary of the university; A. T. Little, chairman of the board of governors; Dr. W. Sherwood Fox, dean of the university; Mayor Wenig, John Pringle, Lieut. Col. Brown, Sir Adam Beck, Philip Pocock, C. R. Somerville, Major T. J. Murphy, J. M. Donahue and many others. Dr. Hugh Stevenson escorted the premier to the grounds.

Mr. Drury participated in the mortar of the science building first, and then conducted the ceremony at the main structure.
