OLD MAN IS ARRESTED

Canadian Press Despatch. Halifax, N.S., Jan. 2.-A virtual prisoner for five years in the hands of a 60-year-old man, is the story of 22year-old Bertha Potter of Bear River, N.S. The girl, who today walked in the sunshine for the first time in half a decade, alleges that William Lent, 62, had kept her incarcerated in a potential dungeon for the whole of that period. The girl, who was an orphan, had gone to live with Lent in 1915, when she was 14 years of age, according to the police, and in 1918. she passed out of sight. Lent was then living alone; his wife had been separated from him, and is now in Massachusetts. The release of the young woman came through the medium of an unknown letter-writer of an unknown letter-writer in the United States, who wrote to a citizen of Bear River asserting that he had seen the girl, scantily clad, in the home of William Lent in 1917. The letter was passed to Attorney General O'Hearn, who ordered an in-

vestigation.

Today police officials proceeded to Bear River, and there released the young woman. She was neatly and apparently in good She declared, however, that for five years she had not been outside the house, and the greater part of her existence had been spent in

Such transfers, therefore, will be left pending until the details in connection with the new stock are worked out

Until March 1 it will be necessary to make a distinction between the old and new shares, since Bank of Hamilton declared a dividend on its outstanding stock for December. The new shares will not be listed on the exchange and will carry only two months' dividend for the current quarter, as compared with the full three months' dividend on the rest of the Commerce shares of the Commerce shares.
