Canadian Press Despatch Toronto, July 10.-The Conboy Building on the Don road in this city, a short distance south of Queen street, jointly occupied by the Conboy Carriage Company and the Dominion Stores, Limited, was completely destroyed by fire this evening, entailing a total loss to building and contents of both firms estimated over \$500,000. Members of both firms were only able to give rough estimates as to the loss tonight.

Only the four walls of the structure remain standing, with the framework of several automobiles suspended from steel girders on what remains of the third floor. There were 43 auto-mobiles in the building, most of which were reduced to ashes. Several were brand new cars, but the bulk of the cars belonged to people who were having new tops put on or receiving equippage such as was specialized in by the Conboy firm.


