A WORD TO THOSE WHO INTEND TO BUILD WHY AND WHEN THE SERVICES OF AN ARCHITECT ARE REQUIRED. Why an Architect is Required. An owner must have information as to what he actually desires before he can 'order' his building, building to suit and to the best advantage.

When construction is under way and owner's interest should be concentrated in the day to day questions which come up. The Architect is the owner's representative on the works.

Now an Architect Works. His means of preliminary consultations, rough sketches and approximate estimates, the requirements of the owner are brought to light. In the Architects' drawing room and office the problem is analyzed.

When the contractor is decided upon, the Architect relieves the owner of the detail work of clearing contracts and places them before the owner with any comment his experience leads him to offer.

The Selection of an Architect. An architect is not a mere contractor or an owner's man. It follows that the owner should assure himself that his architect is honest and worthy of confidence, and that he commands the education and experience, a knowledge of planning and design from both the economic and artistic standpoint; in short that he is a "professional" standing.

Trust your Architect and value his opinions. If you cannot do this, don't choose him. Make your requirements and resources clear. He isn't a mind reader, and he needs to know these things in order to serve you well.

RIFLES SEIZED BY GAME WARDENS Active in the Running Down of Game Law Violators. Great activity is evident among the Game Warden all over the province and it seems to be the aim of all concerned to have as large a number of seized rifles, shotguns and other equipment on hand for the coming autumn as is possible.

Two charges which have been standing for some time in Grand Falls have been amended and are to be tried in the near future. Did Not Appear. One man at Green River was found with a rifle in his possession in the woods. An information was laid against him, but he did not condescend to appear, merely sending an amount of money which he evidently thought would cover his fine. This was not accepted however, and a warrant for his arrest has been issued.

On Sunday Warden Kelly of Sunbury County, seized two rifles which were in the possession of two men in the vicinity of the Portobello Stream. Neither of these men would give their names and their rifles were taken from them in lieu of fines. Game is thick this year, and the temptation is evidently great to lay in a little fresh meat before fifteenth of the coming month, when the game will become more wild, and not so easily killed.

EXPELLED FROM T. AND L. CONGRESS Course Taken Against C. B. R. E. Body At Winnipeg. Winnipeg, Aug. 24.—By a vote of 394 to 151 the Trades and Labor Congress of Canada, the Canadian Brotherhood of Railroad Employees today was expelled from the congress and its charter was revoked. The vote removes from affiliation with the congress between 7,000 and 10,000 members scattered across the whole country for the reason that their organization covers the ground occupied by an international body, the Brotherhood of Railroad and Steamship Clerks, Freight Handlers, etc. The action of the congress went into effect at once. Immediately John Bruce, Toronto, moved that the congress executive be instructed to make every effort to effect a readjustment of the differences between the organization. Carried.

WORLD'S CHAMPION SHORTHAND WRITER Niagara Falls, Ont., Aug. 27.—Albert Schriener, 20 years old, a free lance reporter of New York City, is the world's champion shorthand writer and the youngest that has ever held that title, it was announced at the convention of the National Shorthand Reporters Association here yesterday. He established a world's record when he wrote 175 words a minute in a state literary test without making an error. On questions and answers, jury system, he wrote 200 words a minute with 44 errors. On a change to a jury he wrote 240 words a minute with 22 errors and in one state literary test he wrote 200 words in a minute with twelve errors.
