CHEESE IN UTICA.

Our table, says the Utica Herald, shows the gradual shrinkage that has taken place in two years—nearly one-half in both the receipts and exports, and nearly one-third in price. This is a heavy falling off in two years, but in This is a heavy falling off in two years, but in reality it represents only the depreciation that has taken place in all other classes of farm produce. Dairymen cannot expect that their goods are to maintain former prices if everything else is lower. There must be a relative shrinkage all round. The decrease in exports follows the decrease in receipts, and everybody knows that the latter is caused this year by the late date at which our factories opened.

Altho' the reports from New York are that the market closed weak on Saturday, it is allowed that the stock is well cleaned up, and that even more could have been sold if it had
