SIR,

I have the honour to refer to discussions between representatives of our two Governments concerning the conditions which are to govern the training of Jamaican military personnel in Canada, and to propose that our governments agree that such conditions shall be those set forth in the annexed "Statement of Conditions to Govern the Training of Jamaican Military Personnel by the Canadian Forces in Canada."

If the said conditions are acceptable to your Government I have the honour to propose that this Note together with the attached Annex and your Note in reply to that effect shall constitute an agreement between our Governments which shall be deemed to have come into force on September 9, 1964, the date on which the first Jamaican cadet entered Canada for military training, and which shall continue in force until terminated in the manner prescribed in Paragraph 21 of the Annex.

Accept, Sir, the renewed assurances of my highest consideration.
