PRAYERS.

On motion of Mr. Harris, seconded by Mr. Green, it was ordered,—That the address of His Excellency Guy Mollet, Prime Minister of France, delivered before the Members of the Senate and of the House of Commons of Canada in the Chamber of the House of Commons on March 4, 1957, together with introductory and related speeches, be included in the House of Commons Debates and form part of the permanent records of this Parliament.

Mr. Fulton, seconded by Mr. Lennard, by leave of the House, introduced a Bill, No. 208, An Act to amend the Immigration Act, which was read the first time and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

Mr. Harris, for Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Sinclair, moved,—That the House do go into Committee of the Whole at its next sitting to consider the following proposed Resolution which has been recommended to the House by His Excellency:

That it is expedient to introduce a measure to authorize contributions to be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to provinces in respect of costs incurred by them in providing insured hospital and diagnostic services pursuant to provincial law and to agreements made in accordance with the said measure, to commence when at least six provinces, containing at least half the population of Canada, have entered into such agreements and qualified for the receipt of such contributions.

Resolved,—That the House do go into Committee of the Whole at its next sitting to consider the said proposed Resolution.
