PRAYERS.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk in the following words:—

WEDNESDAY, 11th June, 1941.

Resolved,—That a Message be sent to the Senate to acquaint their Honours that this House concurs in the amendment made by the Senate to Bill No. 88, An Act to amend the Special War Revenue Act, but that this House, while disapproving of any infraction of its privileges or rights by the other House, in this case waives its claims to insist upon such rights and privileges, but the waiver of said rights and privileges is not to be drawn into a precedent; and, further, that this House agrees to the incorporation in the said Bill No. 88 of Bill No. 101, An Act to amend the Special War Revenue Act.

Ordered,—That the Clerk of the House do carry the said Message to the Senate.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill (98), intituled: "An Act to authorize the provision of moneys to meet certain expenditures made and capital indebtedness incurred by the Canadian National Railways System during the calendar year 1941, to provide for the refunding of financial obligations and to authorize the guarantee by His Majesty of certain securities to be issued by the Canadian National Railway Company," was read the third time.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That a Message be sent to the House of Commons to acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, without any amendment.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk with a Bill (102), intituled: "An Act to amend the Senate and House of Commons Act," to which they desire the concurrence of the Senate.

The said Bill was read the first time.

With leave of the Senate,

The said Bill was then read the second and third times.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That a Message be sent to the House of Commons to acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, without any amendment.
