This is to thank you for your very cordial letter of the Sth. inst. with reference to Miss Russell. My purpose in mentioning the matter to ar. Hincks (I was writing him on other tusiness) was to emphasise the importance of scholarship. I think that you will agree with me that the two years Social Service Course is not a serious matter then compared with the Course leading to the B.A. Degree. In the former there is little science and no mathematics, the latter so necessary in treating social statistics.

Twelve Hundred dollars is a handsome amount and should not necessarily go to those who are merely interested and serious 'ut to individuals who at the same time possess a 'certain amount of brains. Good intentions should not 'e confused with ability. To my way of thinking it should 'e a Graduate reward for work well and faithfully don't with strong indications of more to follow.
