ANY thousand acres of the most fertile land in America have recently been made accessible by the construction of the railway from Calgary, on the Bow River, to Edmonton, on the North Saskatchewan, as well as by the new railway from Regina (the capital of the Northwest Territories) into the great delta formed by the junction of the two great branches of the Saskatchewan! Intending settlers can now reach by train, a country which has for some time been known to be almost unrivalled for the fertility of its soil and the possession of wood, water and underlying coal. Southern Alberta has established its reputation as the choice grazing country of North America, and by the construction of the Canadian Pacific Railway, its mines, ranching business and general progress have been enormously developed. Northern Alberta has hitherto been unsettled, though examined and most favourably reported upon, owing
