**A**BOUT the month of October, or November, 1773, divers of the French Roman-Catholicks in the province of Quebeck prepared and signed the following petition to the king, for settling the laws and civil government of the province; and also the following memorial concerning the matters contained in the petition, in which memorial they state the grounds and reasons of the several requests contained in the petition. These papers were transmitted to the earl of Dartmouth, his majesty's secretary of state for America, about the month of December, 1773, and were received by him about the month of February, 1774; and the petition to the king was soon after presented to his majesty.
