It was with justice that the Prime Minister of O ebec, Sir Lomer Gouin, in the great speech which he recently made in the Legislature on Quebec and Confederation, declared that the great majority of the people of Canada are good and fair people, and such being the case French Canadians who constitute one of the most important ethnical groups in the Dominion have a right to expect a fair hearing and justice from their fellow Canadians, the more so considering that their
