BRANT DELEGATES BLOCKED PROGRESS

BRANTFORD, Oct. 8.—(Special.)— The attitude of the delegates from Brant County, declining to vote in Brant County, declining to vote in favor of an industrial farm, because of the fact that they did not wish to bind themselves or the county council, blocked progress at the meeting held here today of the representatives of the six counties, Waterloo, Brant, Elgin, Perth, Norfolk and Oxford.

After Dr. R. W. Bruce Smith had spoken and outlined the need for such a farm and the system in use in Fort William, a vote was taken. The resolution was to the effect that the delegates report back to their councils, recommending the adoption of the industrial farm scheme and advising the appelntment of two delegates from each council to secure further information. This the Brant County delegates did not wish to agree to, as the resolution was passed.

It is not known what the final attitude of Brant County will be, altho it is regarded as likely that the proposition will be favorably looked upon.
