

**PURE WATER NOW
FOR OTTAWA CITY**

Special Bill Will Be Passed in
the Legislature
Today.

MAYOR WILL ASSIST

Reputation of Having a Poor
Supply Will Be Wiped
Out.

The City of Ottawa finally sees some solution of its water supply problem. The City Council has decided to see that active steps are taken to install a plant that will suit the demands of the population. There will be no further voting either in the city or in the house upon what is to be done, but an alternative is laid before the council. Either the Curran McVitty scheme of raising water filtration or the Binnie proposal of piping a pure supply from 21 Mile Lake in the Gatineau system will be adopted by a special bill, which was passed through the private bills committee yesterday.

By a vote of 14 to 5 the committee decided to introduce a government measure introduced by Mr. Hanna for that of Mr. Binnie, which favored the lake scheme. A sub-committee of the committee was appointed to prepare the final draft for report in the house this afternoon.

Considerable opposition was stirred up in committee by members and Ottawa delegates who favored the Curran McVitty scheme and claimed that if the provincial board of health had power to rule out that method, it would force an eight million expenditure on the city regardless of their voice. The Binnie filtration scheme would be much more acceptable. In spite of warm argument, however, the only point gained was that the mayor might assist in drawing up plans and specifications that would do justice to the river scheme. The spirit of the committee and the chairman, Hon. Mr. Hanna, was that the reputation of Ottawa for having a poor water supply should be wiped out forever.

**GIVE PEOPLE A CHANCE
TO GET THEIR MONEY**

Four Years More Allowed for
Completion of Ontario West
Shore Railway.

With the object of allowing holders of shares and bonds some opportunity of getting something for their money, the railway committee of the legislature approved a bill submitted by A. H. Musgrave, to give the Ontario and West Shore Railway four years more to complete the line. The bonds are guaranteed to the extent of \$400,000 by the Townships of Ashfield, Huron, Goderich and Kincardine.

**JUDGING PLANS FOR
