

# COLONEL BURLAND DEAD IN ENGLAND

## Head of Canadian Red Cross Organization Passed Away Suddenly.

MONTREAL, Oct. 9.—A cable from England today announced the death of Lieut.-Col. Jeffrey H. Burland, recently appointed head of the Canadian Red Cross organization at the front.

Col. Burland was known throughout Canada for his philanthropy as well as for his activities in various departments of the militia service.

The colonel left for England on September 29 and his death came as a great shock and surprise to his friends here. The cable announced that Col. Burland died from angina pectoris.

Col. Burland has commanded the Sixth Fusiliers of Montreal and was awarded the officers' decoration for twenty years' service in 1902. He was a member of the small arms committee of Canada, and chairman of the council of the Dominion Rifle Association. He was one of the organizers of the movement for sending a Canadian battalion to England in connection with the celebration of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee, 1897, and accompanied the force. The colonel was present by invitation at the coronation of King Edward and Queen Alexandra and King George and Queen Mary.

Col. Burland, among other benefactions, founded the King Edward Tuberculosis Institute here. He was a member of the Royal Tuberculosis Commission in 1909. He was a generous patron of practically every hospital and charitable institution in Montreal.

Col. Burland was born in Montreal in 1861. He was educated at McGill. Among the business enterprises with which he has been connected are the British American Bank Note Company as president and general manager, and the Dominion Trust Company as president.

"And whereas the Students' Administrative Council is exerting itself actively in behalf of the prevention of such disorders, the council of the faculty of applied science has decided to suspend action."
