Head of Canadian Red Cross Organization Passed Away Suddenly.

Canadian Press Despatch. MONTREAL, Oct. 9 .- A cable from England today announces the death of Lieut,-Col. Jeffery H. Burland, recently appointed head of the Canadian Red Cross organization at the front. Col. Burland was known thrueut Canada for his philanthropy as well as for his activities in various departments of the militia service.

The colonel left for England on September 29 and his death came as a great shock and surprise to his triends here. The cable announced Col. Burland died from angina pectoris. Col. Burland has commanded the Sixth Fusiliers of Montreal and was awarded the officers' decoration for wenty years' service in 1902. He was er of the small arms committee of Canada, and chairman of the council of the Dominion Rifle Association. He was one of the originators of the movement for sending a Canadian bat-talion to England in connection with the celebration of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee, 1897, and accompanied the force. The colonel was present by invitation at the coronation of King Edward and Queen Alexandra and King George and Queen Mary.

Genuine Philanthropist.
Col. Burland, among other benefactions, founded the King Edward Tuberculosis Institute here. He was a nember of the Royal Tuberculosis Commission in 1909. He was a gener-ous patron of practically every hospiand charitable institution in Mont-


NO ACTION TO BE TAKEN BY SCIENCE FACULTY


