Plymouth would walk ficadily in the path fet before them by their worthy predeceffors .- It is worthy of notice, that, with the exception of Pennfylvania, whole proprietor, the great Wm. Penn, the first founder, not confidering the right of difcovery on the part of the Europeans to be a fufficient ground for him to fettle the lands of the Aborigines without their leave first obtained, took. the honeft and peaceable mode of making purchafes of them as the colony extended ; by which judicious procedure the colony of Pennfylvania enjoyed the greatest of all bleffings, Peace ;while her fifter colonies were (with fome exceptions) generally engaged in wars,-In many of which, the greateft of barbarities were exercifed on the unhappy victims who were fo unfortunate as to be taken, too flocking to relate !! and : for more particulars must refer the reader to the history of the times .- As the colonies increased, it had a tendency to raife the mother country, England, into importance in the eyes of Europe. It is a well known fact, that the French had here to the northward extensive colonies, and it is well known, the French and English have for centuries paft, been rival nations .- The incroachment of the French on the colonies, after the peace of. Aix Lachaple in 1748, laid the foundation of the war of 1756,-The unparralled fuccels of the Eng-
