MUSTING OF FISHERS AT FALLS LURED INTO LONELY PLACE MAKE THREE FISH CAPTURES ASSAULTED AND ROBBED

Catch Trains Morning and Evening and Confiscate a Great Many Cases. Malton Butcher Knocked on Head With Whiskey Bottle and Relieved of \$160.

Niagara Falls, Ont., May 6.—Provincial Fish Overseer Shelley, and his assistant, Howard Lake, are covering all points on the Niagara frontier, where Ontario's forbidden fish are leaking into the markets of the United States.

The officers Saturday morning, at 5.30 o'clock, tied up seven boxes at the Michigan Central Station here that were passing thru to the Niagara Falls Co. at Buffalo. The cases contained pickerel (dore), with white fish and mullet from H. Koehler, Dutton, Ont.

The whole lot was consigned to the Niagara Fish Co., Buffalo, being 15 boxes from Bert Clay, Ionia, Ont.; 2 boxes from Johnson and Parish, Ionia, Ont.; 12 boxes from S. F. Rankin, Rodent, Ont.; and 1 box from P. Campbell, Ridgeway, Ont. Each box contained more or less pickerel. The whole lot were put in cold storage, with the others confiscated will be sorted out. Those subject to fish regulation will be given to deserving persons, and the others sold.

Local fish dealers have been put out of business temporarily by the seizures the past few days. On this morning's N.C.R. train there were 18 boxes of fish from H. Koehler, Dutton, who had seven boxes confiscated Saturday, but not one fish that came under the ban was in the consignment this morning.

CAUSE OF DISASTER PLACED NO RESPONSIBILITY ATTACHED. Washington, D.C., May 6.—No further steps will be taken to fix responsibility for the fire on the battleship Kearsarge on April 13, which resulted in ten deaths. An opinion handed down to-day by the judge advocate general of the navy, says the finding of the court of enquiry that nobody should be held responsible for the accident seems to be justified by the evidence submitted.

CAUSE OF EARTHQUAKE. Range of Mountain Split and Part Slid Into Sea. San Francisco, May 5.—Geologists who have been searching since the earthquake of April 16 find the cause of the seismic disturbance, reported that they have found in Sierra Morena mountains, a few miles south of San Francisco, what appears to be an indisputable evidence that the earthquake was due to a change in the mountains. At the summit of the Sierra Morena mountain, near Stanford University, is an immense fissure caused by the earthquake, the appearance of which indicates that the range has split at the top and the side nearer the ocean fallen into the sea.
