BUSINESS EMBARRASSMENTS. The McKendry Estate and Other Assignments Throughout the Province.

The inspectors of the estate of J. N. Mc-Kendry & Co., who recently assigned, have now under consideration an arrangement iooking to a settlement of Mr. McKendry's affairs. The total lisbilities were \$218.437.22 and assets \$154.732.94, the statement showing a nominal deficiency of \$63.704.28. Some of the creditors were, and are still, disposed to fight this claim, and it is a question yet what will be done in regard to this matter. Out of the moneys received from the insurance companies the inspectors have paid the creditors a dividend of 45 cents on the dollar altogether, and be given a clearance by the creditors. Under this arrangement Mr. Goulding would rank as a creditor on the estate and receive his 55 cents.
