ASSASSINS SENTENCED.

Five Men Who Attempted to Kill The President of Brazil Get Their Deserts.

Rio Janeiro, Nov. 5.—Five of the men who were engaged in the plot to assassinate the President of Brazil, Dr. Prudente de Morais, on Nov. 5, 1897, were sentenced today. The so-called ringleader, Dioclesiano, was sentenced to 30 years' imprisonment, and the others had sentences from 14 years to 21 years' imprisonment imposed upon them.

TO BE ABSORBED.

Westinghouse and American Brake Companies to Amalgamate.

St. Louis, Mo., Nov. 5.—The Republic today says: Arrangements have been made for the absorption of the American Brake Company, by the Westinghouse Air Brake Company, and a meeting of the stockholders of the American Company will be held here Nov. 15, to complete the transactions.

The American is a local corporation, capitalized at \$2,000,000.

HIS NECK WAS BROKEN.

Henry Botke Was Plowing and the Horses Ran Away.

Elmira, Nov. 5.—A fatal accident occurred about three miles from here this afternoon on the farm of Henry Martin, in Westley Township. A young man, Herman Botke, had been plowing at some distance from the house, when the horses ran away from him.

When search was made for him he was found in the last stage of neck broken, and he died almost immediately on being removed to the house.

Bellefonte Notes.

Bellefonte, Ont., Nov. 5.—James Chapple, aged 14 years, died this morning from scarlet fever.

Rev. C. W. Welch was elected president of the Bellefonte church, which met yesterday at Shannonville.

A small frame house in Thurlow, owned by Mrs. Donovan, was burned last night; loss about \$500.

George Woodcock, convicted at Bancroft of indecent assault upon Mary Sweet, has been lodged in jail.

UNITED STATES ELECTIONS

Voting Will Take Place in Forty-Two States Tuesday.

Tammany Expected to Carry New York—Massachusetts Carrying on a Heated Campaign—Will Be a Close Contest in New Jersey—Republican Victory Predicted for Connecticut—All Claim Maryland—Illinois May Go Democrat—The Vote in Ohio.

Washington, D.C., Nov. 5.—There will be elections in 42 states Tuesday. In ten of them—Alabama, Arkansas, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Rhode Island and Virginia—only congressmen will be voted for; in one, West Virginia, congressmen and a legislature.

In addition to West Virginia, 22 other states, California, Connecticut, Delaware, Florida, Indiana, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Jersey, New York, North Dakota, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Texas, Utah, Washington, Wyoming and Wisconsin, elect a legislature, which will choose a United States Senator.

In 31 states a governor and a full or partial set of state officers are at stake. The following elect a governor: California, Colorado, Connecticut, Indiana, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Nebraska, New Jersey, New York, Nevada, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, North Dakota, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, South Dakota, Tennessee, Texas, Wisconsin and Wyoming.

In Illinois, Iowa, Florida, Delaware, Missouri, Montana, Ohio, Utah and Washington one or more minor state officers will be contended for.

Tammany May Carry New York.

New York, N.Y., Nov. 5.—The Executive Committee of Tammany Hall held its final meeting this evening at the city hall, this evening. The leaders of all the districts of the County of New York reported in detail the situation in their respective districts and reported a weak opposition on the probable condition in the other boroughs.

The figures given out were that Tammany expects to carry New York County by 70,000 plurality and that the figures from the other boroughs leaders led the committee to make the claim that the Republicans must come to the Harlem Bridge with a plurality of 95,000 if they expect to elect Col. Roosevelt.

Hot Campaign in Massachusetts.

Philadelphia, Nov. 5.—Mass meetings all over the state tonight closed the most heated political campaign that Pennsylvania has experienced in many years. There are four full state tickets in the field. The candidates for Governor are William A. Stone, Republican; G. A. Jones, Democrat; Elias C. Swallow, Prohibitionist; People's Liberty and Honest Government, and J. M. Barnes, Socialist Labor. The followers of Stone, Jones and Swallow are expected to have a considerable degree of confidence that their favorite will be elected and there is every indication that each of the three candidates will receive a heavy vote. For over a month these three nominees have been addressing meetings, each having traveled over the entire state and delivered addresses in many towns in three and even four different counties. In addition to the candidates themselves, the state has been stumped by scores of other speakers. The present delegation in Congress comprises 27 Republicans and three Democrats. It is generally believed the Democrats will regain a few of the districts by them in the congressional election of 1899.

Will Be a Close Election.

Newark, N.J., Nov. 5.—One of the hottest contests ever canvassed in New Jersey practically closed tonight. Both Voorhees and Crane, their rival candidates for the governorship, have worked day and night for the past month. Both sides appear to be confident of success, but the leaders of the two parties are having a hard time of it. The Voorhees campaign was not inclined to boast much about figures. Everybody expressed the opinion that it looked like a close election.

How It May Go in Connecticut.

New Haven, Conn., Nov. 5.—Impartial observers are inclined to predict the election of George L. Dyer, the Republican candidate for governor, with all of his colleagues on the Republican ticket. The State Legislature is looked by experts as easily Republican on the joint ballot, while in the four congressional districts three Republicans are practically sure of election.

Both Are Making Claims.

Baltimore, Md., Nov. 5.—Both Republicans and Democrats are claiming five of the six members of the Maryland delegation to Congress. A conservative estimate gives the Democrats the first and fifth districts with a possibility in the third.

Democrats Are Confident.

Chicago, Ill., Nov. 5.—The present congressional delegation consists of 17 Republicans, four Democrats and one Fusionist. The Republicans claim they will carry the first one or two seats. The Democrats, on the contrary, are confident of carrying Chicago and if they do their expectation of several new congressmen may be realized.

The Vote in Ohio.

Cincinnati, Ohio, Nov. 5.—While the Republicans will likely carry the state, the Democrats claim the Republicans cannot gain any congressmen. On the last presidential vote the Republicans secured 15 and the Democrats 6 congressmen.

IT WAS A BIG SURPRISE.

A Fender Saves a Child From Going Under a Street Car.

Little 6-year-old Lizzie Croft figured in an accident yesterday that might have proved fatal to her, but for the working order of a fender on a trolley. About 3 o'clock she was on Queen-street west, near Tupper-street, and in attempting to cross the street she ran in front of an east-bound Queen car, No. 298, in charge of Motorman McGraw and Conductor George Roach. When in the middle of the track she became excited and stood still. The car, which was going at a speedy rate, struck her little sister, and as it happened picked her up, instead of going over her, as it has done in most cases, and held her until the car was stopped, several feet distant. The little girl was picked up by the fender by the motorman and was unhurt, but terribly frightened. The incident goes to show that, notwithstanding the many attempts made to cry-down the efficiency of the present fender in use, it still can prevent accidents. The child lives at 208 Richmond-st. west.
