AN EXPLOSION HURTS THREE

On Saturday afternoon, in the works of the Gutta Percha & Rubber Company, 135 West Lodge-avenue, a trifling accident oc-

They carried a lantern, and some of the coad oil they pour-ed on the joint of the pipe feil into the lantern and exploded. Higgin had his face and head badly cut, while Kyle and McLean were also burned and cut. Dr. Hart was called, and after attending to their injuries the patients were taken home.
