

SIR EVELYN WOOD'S COMMAND.

Has Charge of 2nd Army Corps, With Headquarters at No. 10, Dundas St. E., London, Oct. 10.—The Daily Mail says: The War Office states that the first and third army corps command at Aldershot and Dublin respectively will be formed from Oct. 1. Sir Evelyn Butler, who was appointed to the Aldershot district in October, 1898, will retain the command for the two years of his appointment, which are still unexpired, while the Duke of Connaught, who has over three years unexpired, will similarly retain his command in Ireland.

GERMAN SAILOR ASSAULTED.

Trouble at Port of Spain May Make Trouble for Venezuela. Port of Spain, Trinidad, Oct. 10.—(via Haytian cable).—The British royal mail steamer Edwin arrived here to-day from Lagaira, Venezuela, and brought the following reliable story: Last Sunday night about 50 sailors of the German cruiser Vesta were engaged in a street row, at Porto Cabello, with the local population. Abuse in various degrees, including the use of firearms, was used by the sailors, and the local police were called upon to disperse them. The Vesta's boat, which was attacked by the police, was damaged, and the sailors were wounded. The incident is believed to be a result of the sailors' dissatisfaction with their pay and conditions.

DISCOVERED AT WOLFFEG CASTLE

Trunk Line Railway Will Consider His Availability. New York, Oct. 10.—The World says: The Executive officers of the Trunk Line Railroad will meet to-day for the purpose of considering a report prepared by President Theodore of the Lackawanna Railroad, and other railroad men, recommending the abolishing of the free-pass system. It is not expected that the report will be adopted, as many of the most prominent railroad men in the country think that such a movement is impracticable.

He is on his way to Canada to attend the laying of a cornerstone for an extension to the Kingston University, at Kingston, Ont., on Oct. 14, and to be present at the reception to the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York.

FOUR TRAINMEN KILLED.

Lombard, Ill., Oct. 10.—Four trainmen were killed and three others were slightly injured in a collision of freight trains on the Chicago, Great Western Railroad, one mile east of here to-day. The dead: Engineer Charles Andrews, Fireman Houston, Fireman J. Mayher and Brakeman William Ginn. The cause of the wreck is not yet known.

ON CHARGE OF HUSBAND MURDER.

Dayton, Ohio, Oct. 10.—Pending an investigation, which will determine whether or not the charge of murder shall be preferred against Mrs. Mary Belle Wittwer, suspected of causing a number of deaths by poisoning, she is still in custody. Her husband, Frank D. Wittwer, the fourth and last of three children of Mrs. Emma C. Pugh, her sister, both of whom are supposed to have been victims, were disinterred early to-day. The vital organs of both bodies were removed, placed in sealed jars, and turned over to Professor Howard H. Henshaw, who will make an examination for traces of poison.

NITRO-GLYCERINE EXPLODED.

Oil City, Pa., Oct. 10.—Harper's Nitro-glycerine factory, at Bradford, Pa., from which this city was blown up to-day. The cause of the explosion will never be known, as the only persons about the place at the time were intending to leave. The explosion occurred at 11:30 a.m., and the factory, which was built by the late A. G. Grant, 54 Dole St., Montreal.

FIRE AT PORT ELGIN.

Port Elgin, Ont., Oct. 10.—At an early hour this morning fire was discovered in the old Royal Hotel building, formerly owned by the late A. G. Grant, 54 Dole St., Montreal. The fire was caused by a gas stove in the kitchen, and the building was completely destroyed. The cause of the fire is not yet known.
