Save 100 Babies Yearly.

"When Dr. Hill made the infant mortality survey previous to the child welfare exhibit a year ago his estimate was that 100 babies could be saved every year in London by proper child welfare and public health service.

Mayor C. R. Somerville commented that the sum of \$800,000 is being asked for public health in Toronto for this year, and that Toronto City will give at least \$200,000 more than for last year. Proportionately, he stated, London should be spending \$40,000 or \$50,000 a year on public health.

The regulations provide for absolutely sanitary conditions in bakeries which will be under the eye of inspectors.

Tuberculosis Leads.

The report of contagious diseases presented by Dr. Downham shows that tuberculosis had a big lead in communicable diseases reported during January, 32 cases in all. Diphtheria came second with 24 cases, and chicken
