

TORONTO, July 25 .- Arnold Love's startling confession that it was he, not his father, Henry Love, who killed Mrs. Henry Love in Grey County, and for which murder his father was hanged seven years ago, has been investigated by the attorney-general's department. As a result of the investigation it is thought nothing further will be done in the matter.

Arnold, who was about fourteen years of age at the time of the murder, is an epileptic and in the opinion of specialists in mental disease he has imagined himself the murderer. The circumstances do not bear him out in his remarkable story. Love was in Toronto today and stuck to his "confession" and Rev. G. N.
