Magazine is Second and Besom Third—Pimlico Opens To-day.

AQUEDUCT, April 19.—The track at Aqueduct was still heavy and holding to-day as a result of the heavy recent rains. The fields, however, were not reduced, and the racing was very interesting. The Peconic Handicap, with a value of \$1500, at six furlongs, resulted in an easy victory for King Cobalt, who was played down from 5 to 1 to 1 at the end. He took the lead early and was never extended. Albert Terrazas, president of the Jockey Club of Juarez, Mexico, was an interested spectator of the races to-day. He said racing would continue for the next 19 years at the course over the line from El Paso, 57 to 58 miles.
