Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations.

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta.

Application must be made in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the land to be homesteaded, or by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years, homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price, \$20.00 per acre.

Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 30 acres, erect a house worth \$200.
