RECRUITING DRAGS

WITH STEADY PACE

Twenty-Four Attested Yesterday at Depot for Overseas.

Recruiting results yesterday were 24 attested out of 46 who came up for examination. Recruiting has assumed a steady pace in the city, and yesterday's results compare favorably with those of other days. The results are as follows: 24th, 1; 21st, 2; 28th, 7; No. 1 Construction Battalion, 3; 6th Battery, 4; 7th Battery, 2; and the Army Service Corps, 1.

The 49th and 70th Battalions will go to Niagara Camp in a few days. There advanced drill in artillery work will be given.

The 24th Battalion (the Beavers), of which Lieut.-Col. W. H. Price, is the commanding officer, has now a strength of 117 men. The battalion is nearly full strength, and much of the success in securing recruits has been due to the untiring efforts of Capt. J. Lawson.

Notwithstanding the intensely hot weather of the past week, the 24th O.S. Battalion, whose recruiting area is that section of the city lying west of the C.P.R. and G.T.R. tracks, had a successful week, attesting about 30 men. The people of West Toronto are telling the young men of their district that for the credit of the community there is only one battalion to join—the 24th.

Ravens, Barracks, the home and training ground of the 24th, is a paradise this hot weather. The spacious and airy mess and sleeping quarters, the hot and cold shower baths and shaded and woody slopes are all proving most attractive. Those young men who listen to the nightly recruiting appeals at Dundas and Keele streets cannot but be favorably impressed with the sincerity and earnestness of the officers and men. Captain (Rev.) J. A. McArthur has been appointed chaplain. Lieut.-Col. Wallace, the commanding officer of the battalion, is endeavoring to complete his unit with good men, both physically and morally.

Mobilizing Construction Unit.

Lieut.-Col. B. Ripley and Captain London of No. 1 Construction Battalion, arrived in Valcartier camp yesterday with the orderly office staff to make final arrangements for the mobilization of the battalion. They brought 60 men with them from Toronto, leaving three officers here to recruit the 50 men needed to complete the battalion. Any man wishing to go overseas quickly should join up at once, as the Construction Battalion will give him an opportunity to do his duty and at the same time allow him to pick up some useful knowledge in construction work.

The 21st American Legion Battalion is still maintaining the record it set some time ago in the number of recruits secured each week. The battalion now has a strength of about 400 and 50 recruits are added each week.

169th Battalion Honored.

The model camp at the Exhibition will be occupied by the members of the 169th Battalion, of which Lieut.-Col. Wright is the commanding officer.
