The postage on letters intended for England to go by the Atlantic Steamers, can be paid or not, at the option of the sender: due notice is always given at the Post-Office, and in the public Papers, of the time of closing the mail by these steamers. The mail for them that goes by way of Boston, [and on which the postage to Boston must be paid,] is in general made up a week after that which goes by Halifax. Newspapers, Magazines, and other printed papers not subject to

the party for whom they are intended should be written on the margin of the Paper as well as on the wrapper or cover in which they are enclosed,—this ensures their delivery in case of the cover becoming destroyed; but it is to be particularly observed that newspapers intended to go free via Halifax, must have no mark, initials, or date, but the address merely, or they will be charged full letter postage.
