post.)In considering the future of Canadian  
economic conditions, there is one under-  
lying feature which must not be over-  
looked. I refer to the overwhelming  
balance of trade in favor of this country.  
Month by month this balance is accumu-  
lating, with the result that Canada's  
commercial position among the nations  
of the world is improving daily. An im-  
mense sum of money is being disbursed  
in Canada for munitions and other war  
supplies, the major portion of which  
finds its way into the pockets of our  
own people, and is available for financ-  
ing of additional orders.No clearer evidence of our prosperity  
can be given than the fact that Canada,  
a country of barely seven million people,  
has already raised over three hundred  
millions of dollars for war purposes, and  
is now planning to float a further large  
loan, with every expectation of com-  
plete success. Practically all branches  
of industry are in a highly flourishing  
condition, and the majority of our cor-  
porations are being enabled to place them-  
selves in a strong financial position. The  
result of this condition will become more  
evident upon the resumption of normal  
business.While one feels some reluctance in at-  
tempting to forecast conditions which  
may prevail after the war, it is evident  
that the depletion of stocks and the  
neglect of all but absolutely necessary  
maintenance and renewal expenditures  
since the outbreak of the war, brought

Plaintiff in Suit Tells How Octopus Was  
Made for Movies.J. Ernest Williamson had just begun  
testifying before Judge Manton in the  
Federal District Court in New York in  
his suit against the Universal Film Man-  
ufacturing Company for \$4,750 alleged to  
be due for services in connection with  
taking pictures of sea monsters to illus-  
trate the film play of Jules Verne's  
novel of "Twenty Thousand Leagues  
Under the Sea" when the case was ad-  
judged.Williamson has an apparatus called a  
submarine tube, with which he says he  
can take pictures of moving creatures at  
a depth of more than fifty feet. The  
plaintiff testified that the pictures were  
taken in the waters of the Bahamas in  
March, 1915, and that the submarine  
of Captain Nemo, the hero of the  
novel, was only a shell and was sup-  
ported on the surface by pontoons. One  
of the scenes in the picture is a fight  
between an octopus and a diver. But  
as the octopus is not a part of the Med-  
iterranean a substitute had to be  
achieved.This was accomplished by a system of  
rubber hose, it was said, to represent  
the eight tentacles, and of sheet rubber  
was made the small, round body with  
its gleaming eyes. He also told some  
details of his picture-taking device, of  
the men and of how the tube is  
sometimes fastened to the bottom of a  
barge. He has taken good pictures of  
living fish at a distance of 200 feet, he  
said.Mr. Hartman in opening the trial di-  
lated upon the arts which have made  
moving pictures so attractive. W. H.  
Griffin, for the plaintiff, explained that  
the contract his client had with the de-
