The daily casualty list should stir the blood of the young men of Canada who are free to go but who have not yet donned the King's uniform.

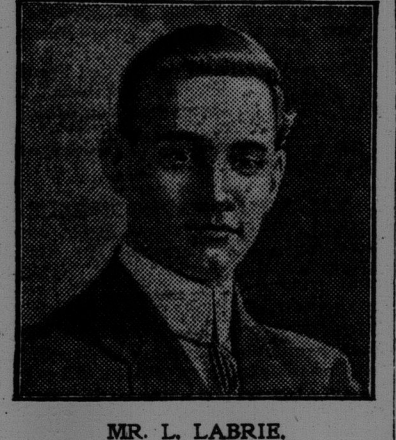
Hon. Mr. Hazen is coming to St. John for another week. It will take more than a week to harmonize the warring factions in the Tory party hereabouts.
