

# TWENTY U.S. NAVAL OFFICERS REFUSED

Washington, July 2—President Wilson has denied the application for voluntary retirement of twenty commanders and lieutenant-commanders of the navy, who sought to leave the active list under the law which permits such retirements on June 80, when promotions from the grade of junior lieutenant have been less than forty during the preceding year.

Department officials, said, so far as they knew, none of the twenty applicants had received offers from the private warmunitions establishments which have been seefing to employ army and navy officers.
