#### U. N. B. Wins Western Title From Mt. A. With Free Kick

FREDERICTON, Nov. 4.—The University of New Brunswick won the western section of the Maritime Intercollegiate Rugby Football League beating Mount Allison 3-0, this afternoon. The score was a penalty goal to nil. The free kick was given U. N. B. a minute or two before half time, because a Mount Allison forward failed to kick a U. N. B. man off the ball after it was held. Chestnut took the kick from a good position and put it over.

In the second period Mount Allison was given two free kicks in positions as favorable, but each kick went wide and the U. N. B. fullback touched down.

**HARD FIGHT.**  
The game was the closest and hardest fought seen here in many a day. Mount Allison, although not displaying offensive power which could penetrate the Red and Black, fielded a strongly defensive team. Often the visitors got away on runs which looked good for tries, but the U. N. B. back division could cope with them. Late in the second half Goodspeed, the left wing for U. N. B. three-quarter, was collared by Stuart five yards off the Mount Allison line and lost the ball, which was recovered by Captain Bill Donohue, who in turn was stopped about six feet short of the line. That was about as near as the U. N. B. came to putting over a try.

Several times the Mount Allison forwards were as close to the U. N. B. line, but the Red and Black was able to work the ball out each time.

**WEATHER NOT GOOD.**  
The game was played under weather conditions none too favorable. There

had been a drizzle of rain although the footing was good. The teams were very evenly matched and play went from end to end, sometimes very rapidly, furnishing many thrills.

The game was largely a battle of the two forward lines. The two packs were evenly matched, but the U. N. B. pack had somewhat the better of the argument in the second period. There was comparatively little open field running by the back divisions, but in that department Mount Allison outplayed the U. N. B.

**GET AWAY FASTER.**  
The visitors' back got away faster, made their passes while on the dash without slackening their speed and varied their attack. Bud Wilson, back of the scrum making long, daring passes to get the ball out to the wings.

One reason the U. N. B. backs did not get away better was that Mount Allison players successfully broke through and nailed them in their tracks before they had time to get started.

The play was so hard and rugged that there were frequent stops to give players opportunity to recover from injuries which stopped them temporarily. Every few minutes a player failed to come up after being tackled and play had to be stopped with the result that when the game was over both teams were pretty well battered up. In addition there were some fuffs on the side lines.

On one occasion McLennan, one of the U. N. B. forwards, was tackled by Cobb and rushed into the crowd to take a solid poke at a rabid Mount Allison rooster who had been taunting him from what he believed was a point of safety. Others got into the melee. The lone police officer on the grounds was called, the crowd swarmed on the field and play was halted for about five minutes.
