

# AMENDMENTS IN AUTO LICENSE BILL

Owner, Licensed Driver, or Chauffeur Permitted to Drive Cars in N. B.

FREDERICTON, N. B., April 30—
Any registered owner, holder of a driver's permit, licensed chauffeur or person accompanied by a registered chauffeur, may operate a motor vehicle in New Brunswick, according to the in New Brunswick, according to the bill to amend and consolidate the Motor Vehicle Law as finally amended by the legislature.
