**SCHOOL CASE IN NOVA SCOTIA**

Appeal of Teacher Convicted in Dartmouth Court of Beating School Girl, Dismissed in County Court.

(Halifax Chronicle)

The appeal of Grover Beasley, teacher in the Dartmouth high school, from the decision of Judge Foster, in the Dartmouth Police Court, in which he was fined \$400 and costs on the charge of James Renner, who submitted that he (Beasley) had beaten his daughter Hattie, was dismissed by Judge Wallace in the County Court yesterday and the judgment of the trial magistrate was sustained.

Hattie Renner was the first witness called. She admitted "talking in the line" and being sent in company with four other girls to the office. She also testified as to the effect of the punishment on her hands. Miss Norman, teacher of Grade VII, repeated her evidence given before Judge Foster in which she testified as to the children's absence after recess from the grade and the return of the girls, particularly Hattie Renner, whose condition was cited as being very weak and nervous. The teacher stated that the child had collapsed on her way to her seat and had to be assisted there and later had to be taken from the class room and assisted to her home.

Mrs. Renner, mother of the little girl testified as to her condition and that she (Hattie) had to miss school the rest of the day and the whole of the following day. The other pupils punished, Jean Carter, Ruby Farquharson, Florence Lynch and Dorothy Morash also testified as to the cause of punishment and the effect it had. Florence Lynch admitted laughing in the office and also testified that she had marks on her wrist for a week following the strapping. Mrs. Lynch and Mrs. Carter also testified as to the children's condition when they reached home.

**Principal Testifies.**

W. C. Stapleton, principal of the Dartmouth schools, testified that Mr. Beasley was his assistant and was in charge when he (Stapleton) was not present. Miss Findlay was the vice principal of the school. Children were sent to Park school from all schools for punishment. He did not recall ever strapping a girl, the lady teachers did that, but Miss Findlay had delegated Mr. Beasley to punish girls for her. Mr. Beasley had taught three years in Dartmouth and was a satisfactory teacher.

Cross examined by Mr. Cluney regarding Mr. Beasley's appointment as assistant Mr. Stapleton could not state that the appointment was in writing. Grover Beasley stated that he found the five girls in the office when he returned from lining up the boys. He knew they were sent to the office for punishment. He held no conversation with Roscoe the janitor and when he inquired of the girls their reason for being sent there, Number 1 and 4 laughed. He had since learned that either of these girls the Renner child. Cross examined, Mr. Beasley said Miss Findlay was able to punish girls but had at least on one occasion sent a pupil to him to be strapped. She did not care to punish the children because she had in many cases taught their parents and sometimes their grandparents.

**Argument of Counsel.**

In summing up the case Mr. Roper, counsel for Mr. Beasley, said that if discipline was to be sustained in the schools punishment must be administered and he asked the judge to consider this in his decision. While admitting that discipline must be upheld and the authority of the school teachers sustained, Mr. Cluney argued that the rights of the pupils should be protected and that teachers must punish sanely and not while in a fit of temper. Mr. Beasley punished the girls without investigation and because two of them laughed.

Judge Wallace in giving judgment held that the defendant in this case had sufficient authority to administer punishment to the pupils. The real question was whether the punishment inflicted was reasonable or excessive.

**VICTIM TO BE SUED FOR BEING ROBBED**

Dress Contractor's Action Declared Mistrial—Defendant Makes Counter Claim.

New York, May 23.—By the action of Supreme Court Justice Gieglersch in declaring a mistrial in a suit of Herman L. Flann, a dress contractor, against the Bijou Waist Company, a jury will determine soon whether Flann can be held liable for negligence because burglars entered his shop three times within a month and stole material delivered to him by the Bijou Waist Company to be made into dresses, and also several completed dresses.

The jury also decide whether the defendant should be required to pay for the labor of making up dresses from its own materials after the dresses had been stolen and Flann had insisted that his burglary insurance covered only his own property. The courts have held in such cases that the contractor must pay if they are shown to be negligent in protecting goods entrusted to their care.

Judge Gieglersch, attorney for the Bijou Waist Company, asked that the court permit him to amend his answer and make a counter-claim for \$3,728 for the stolen goods, following an extensive cross-examination of Mr. Flann in which the attorney brought out admissions from the plaintiff which caused Justice Gieglersch to consent to the counter-claim. Counsel for Flann then told the court he could not go on with the trial because he was not prepared to meet the new issues introduced in the case and the court declared a mistrial.

Mr. Flann sued for \$8600 for labor and services in making dresses for the waist company. He contended that the garments for which he charged were finished and hanging on his racks ready for delivery on April 21 1922 but testified that during the previous night his place was robbed of some of the finished dresses and a quantity of material belonging to the waist company as well as goods of his own. Entry to said was made through the rear windows.

The plaintiff alleged further that on April 30 another robbery occurred entrance being made this time through the front door and other dresses and material belonging to the Bijou Company were stolen. He contended that burglars broke in a third time on May 18 and took more of the Bijou Company's property.

Flann insisted that the Bijou Company should not only bear the loss of the missing goods but pay for the work done on the dresses stolen.

Attorney Gieglersch sought to show that Flann did not take reasonable precaution to protect the goods of his customer if three burglaries could occur within a month and no insurance was placed or protective measures taken even after the second burglary with the exception of applying for the services of a watchman which he said had not been obtained when the third loss occurred. Flann insisted that the \$8,600 policy he carried was designed to protect his own merchandise, and admitted that he did not increase the insurance after any of the robberies, although the first loss was \$6,840.

The plaintiff testified on cross-examination that in his first proof of loss to the insurance company he included \$1,600 as the value of eighty-nine dresses and some material belonging to the Bijou Company.

The proof of loss in the second burglary showed that all but \$400 of the claim of \$3,840 was for property belonging to the Bijou Company. Mr. Gieglersch contended. The third loss of \$219 was entirely of property belonging to the defendant, it was alleged.
