Pure Air for Infants

Every one admits that fresh air is necessary for young children, but this is taken generally, to mean that rooms should be well ventilated and that children should be frequently taken out into the open air. Certainly, it is very requisite that both of these things should be carried out. Yet there are many infants that sleep in well ventilated rooms and are given frequent airings, that breathe very impure air during many hours out of the twenty-four.

If a child be sunk in a deep crib, the sides of which are carefully screened against draughts, no matter how pure the air in the room in general may be, the air immediately surrounding the baby will soon become unwholesome. The old-fashioned rocking cradle had grave faults peculiar to itself, but, by its motion, it, at least, provided the child with fresh air. Answering your favor of recent date in regard to the influence of light on the quality of beer, will say that our observations, extending over the last twenty-five years, have convinced us beyond a doubt that exposure of beer to light has a very detrimental influence on its quality generally, but especially upon the flavor of the beer.

We have tested beers repeatedly in this direction placing the bottles into direct sunlight, and testing the same after one, two, three and five minutes exposure, found that the beer with three and five minutes exposure became undrinkable on account of the peculiar odor developed.

The detrimental effect of light upon beer can be successfully counteracted by the employment of brown or dark colored glass bottles, and such bottles are therefore recommendable.

"Beer bottles should be manufactured from reddish-brown glass, inasmuch as same will to a much higher degree than any other kind of glass, minimize the influence of the rays of light on the quality of beer, and will protect the latter against acquiring the disagreeable taste (Sonnengeschmack) due to the chemical action of the light."

"In white and green glass bottles the beer is most affected by the action of the light. Such bottles are, therefore, absolutely inappropriate and should never be employed by brewers." (Signed) Prof. Dr. E. Schonfeld.

"Bottles of strong glass should be selected. They should never be of colorless glass, inasmuch as through the influence of light the beer will not only take on a disagreeable odor and taste, but will also become turbid." (Linter).

"The beer in the white glass bottle had taken on disagreeable odor and taste and was absolutely undrinkable. The beer in the dark bottles did not show this peculiar odor and taste." (G. Beck).

"It is interesting to note the observation that beer in colorless bottles exposed to diffused light will undergo a change, precipitating a heavy sediment and taking on a disagreeable odor and taste."

"It is a known fact that sunlight and daylight influence unfavorably the taste and flavor of the beer and care must be exercised in the selection of the bottles."

Daily Hints For the Cook

JELLY ROLL WITH ONE EGG
One egg, one-third cup sugar, 3 table-spoons milk (sweet), 3-4 teaspoon baking powder sifted into 1-2 cup flour (good measure), pinch salt. Beat all together. Cook in a narrow, long pan, put on jelly and roll while warm and sprinkle with sugar.

SWEDISH BUNS.
Take one pound of light bread dough, add half cup butter, roll out four inch thick, spread with butter, sugar, cinnamon and currants. Fold as for jelly roll, cut into half inch slices, set these rings side up in a pan, let rise to double their bulk and bake. Ice when cold.

THE VALLEY ROAD CHEAPENED TO BENEFIT CONTRACTOR?

Ottawa, June 3—Railway subsidies, and especially the advances to MacKenzie & Mann, blew up a lively storm in parliament today. During the discussion of the subsidies, E. B. Carvell and Mr. Michaud found time to say some things about the St. John Valley railway.

Mr. Carvell declared that the province was not going to have the first class line which had been arranged for by the late government. With the concurrence of Premier Fleming, Contractor Gould was cheapening the road, increasing both grades and curves. Whenever Gould wanted any change from the conditions in his contract he brought Premier Fleming to Ottawa and the railway government agreed to whatever they wanted done. Engineer Taylor was trying to get a good road, but was not being allowed to compel the contractor to make one.

Mr. Carvell stated that the standard

of the road had been so reduced that north of Fredericton it would not cost \$20,000 a mile, though the aid given was \$81,000 a mile. On this portion of the system there would be not less than \$700,000 profit.

Hon. Mr. Cochrane introduced the Canadian Northern aid with a statement that the subsidy would total \$15,040,000. The Ottawa to Fort Arthur portion of the line had been aided by sale of guaranteed bonds to the amount of \$94,000,000, while the construction would cost \$54,000,000. The Canadian Northern had been less generously aided than had the C. P. R. or the G. T. R.

William German declared that the real controller of the Canadian Northern situation was Z. A. Lash, of Toronto, who got up the round robin against reciprocity, securing the name of Mr. White among others.

"Where were you?" asked Premier Borden.

"I was not with them," said Mr. German. "I was against reciprocity all right."
