(Pearson's Weekly, London) If gold is one of the rarest and most valuable metals it is also one of the most widely diffused. We all handle gold. We have it in our purses as mon-ey, round our fingers, wrists, on necks, as rings, bracelets or necklets, and we wear it in our mouths as fillings for our

The amount of gold used by dentists is very considerable, and even dentists have no idea of how much goes to waste in the workshops where they make plates and the like. Some little time ago plates and the like. Some little time ago a Cheltenham dentist was moving house. A friend, standing in his dismantled workshop, which was in the basement of the house, remarked that there must be a good deal of gold in the floor.

The dentist thought it over and decided to take the floor up. He made a profit of \$70 after paying expenses from profit of £70 after paying expenses from the tiny particles of gold recovered from


