TRADES AND LABOR

CONGRESS CALL ISSUED The Trades and Labor Congress of Canada has issued the following convention Office of the Secretary-Treasurer, 112 Florence street, Ottawa, Ont. July 2nd, 1912.

CONGRESS CALL ISSUED

The twenty-eighth annual session of the Trades and Labor Congress of Canada will convene in the Armour's building, Huskisson street, city of Quebec, province of Ontario, beginning at 10 o'clock, Monday morning, Sept. 9, 1912, and will continue in session from day to day until the business of the convention has been completed.

CONGRESS CALL ISSUED

The delegates assembled at Calgary last year chose Quebec as the next meeting place, and it will be a striking tribute to the enthusiasm and enduring ability to the organized workers of the "Rocky and progressive city and surrounding industrial centres in the heart of the province of Ontario to have a large representation of delegates from all over Canada in attendance. The bill of fare to be presented is one that will require the very best intelligence of the delegates to grapple with.

CONGRESS CALL ISSUED

The past year has been replete with matters of vital interest to the workers, and the opponents of organized labor are very active, as will appear from the systematic and persistent endeavor being made in Canada and Great Britain to weaken regulations that were imposed for the protection of the working classes. Each year has witnessed a wonderful growth in the intricacy and difficulty of the problems to be dealt with by the congress, and the English convention will be no exception in this respect. Among other matters calling for immediate attention are the following: 1. Dominion and provincial legislation affecting labor interests.

CONGRESS CALL ISSUED

2. The Alien Labor Act and its utter uselessness to protect the working class in its present cumbersome administration. 3. The Immigration law. 4. The eight-hour bill. 5. The Workmen's Compensation acts by the various provinces—administration by provincial governments and their interpretation by the courts.

CONGRESS CALL ISSUED

6. Proposed amendments to the Dominion Elections Act, to make election day a public holiday and to abolish the \$20 deposit now exacted. 7. Payment of wages on railways for the night and many other features. "Never more than now has there been greater necessity for vigilance in safeguarding the rights of labor. Organized bodies everywhere are contesting for their own protection, and in this regard labor no longer has the field to itself. If labor is to receive its portion it will have to keep watchful every hour of every day. "Send your best, most experienced and faithful men to the convention, and elect them NOW. If you neglect to do so, don't complain that your particular interests have been overlooked or neglected. It is the time of prosperity, and labor must be prepared to do battle at every available opportunity if it is to keep up the procession.

CONGRESS CALL ISSUED

MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRE The minister of militia of Canada has called \$1,000 to be added to the Queen Mary fund in the Biscuit meet. This is the first time any of the colonies has contributed. Forest fires around Halifax have been causing alarm and yesterday it was necessary for a large force to turn out to fight the flames in the Sir Sanford Fleming Park surrounding the memorial tower and also in Dartmouth. A man giving his name as John Willett of Oldtown, Me., was arrested on a C. P. train on Wednesday last between Fredericton and Bristol charged with throwing a woman passenger's suit out of the train. He was found guilty and given three months. Four men have been drowned in the Fraser river in the stream driving operations. They were two Scotchmen named Mitchell, an Englishman named Thompson, and one other whose name is unknown. They were swept off a raft. Richard O'Leary, of Richibucto, N. B., Hon. J. Y. McLean, of Souris, E. E. I. and C. Y. Wilson, of Halifax have been appointed a dominion commission to enquire into oyster fishing in the maritime provinces, which has been on the decline. Professor E. E. Prince, of the Fisheries Department is an excellent member. Woodstock, N. B., July 3.—(Special)—A young lad named Hannigan had a narrow escape from drowning today by falling in the mill pond among the logs. He was rescued by Gaven Brown after great difficulty, and both were taken from the water in an exhausted state. Sioux City, Iowa, July 3.—Charged with the murder of the Joseph Moore family of six and two guests at Villisca, Conn., June 10, Frank Roberts, a negro, is held by the local police. Sheriff Jackson, of Red Oak, Iowa, will arrive here today with a warrant for Roberts' arrest.
