TWO MORE SOLDIER HOSPITALS SOON TO BE RELINQUISHED

Hon. Dr. Beland Reports Steady Decline in Number of Patients Treated With, However, Tendency Toward More Mental Cases.

(Canadian Press Despatch.) Ottawa, Feb. 27—Hon. Dr. Beland observed, when estimates for the department of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment were before the House today, that the total was a decrease of \$2,411,000 from the previous year.

Three hospital out of seventeen under the administration of the department had been closed during the last year and two more such institutions would be relinquished within the next two or three months, the patients being distributed to other hospitals.

S. W. Jacobs, Liberal, George's River, called attention to a press dispatch in which Rt. Hon. Arthur Meighen was alleged to have said that a saving of \$3,000,000 had been made last year at the expense of widows and orphans of veterans. Dr. Beland said such a statement was inaccurate and he was unwilling to believe that the leader of the Opposition had made it.

Sir Henry Drayton, Conservative, York West, said what he had seen in the newspapers was to the effect that Mr. Meighen, dealing with pledges made by the government, had said the only thing done was to make a reduction of some \$3,000,000 in the soldiers' civil re-establishment estimates at the expense of widows and orphans.

TWO MORE SOLDIER HOSPITALS SOON TO BE RELINQUISHED

Hon. Dr. Beland Reports Steady Decline in Number of Patients Treated With, However, Tendency Toward More Mental Cases.

(Canadian Press Despatch.) Ottawa, Feb. 27—Hon. Dr. Beland observed, when estimates for the department of Soldiers' Civil Re-establishment were before the House today, that the total was a decrease of \$2,411,000 from the previous year.

Three hospital out of seventeen under the administration of the department had been closed during the last year and two more such institutions would be relinquished within the next two or three months, the patients being distributed to other hospitals.

S. W. Jacobs, Liberal, George's River, called attention to a press dispatch in which Rt. Hon. Arthur Meighen was alleged to have said that a saving of \$3,000,000 had been made last year at the expense of widows and orphans of veterans. Dr. Beland said such a statement was inaccurate and he was unwilling to believe that the leader of the Opposition had made it.
