PRESTON DEFENDS SUBSIDY PROPOSAL

Says Combine Must be Crushed to Cut Rates Third to Half.

Canadian Press Despatch. TORONTO, March 18.—Vigorously defending the proposed steamship subsidy by the federal government before the Toronto Men's Liberal Association, W. T. R. Preston, who recently submitted his report on North Atlantic freight rates situation, declared that representatives of Australia, South Africa and other countries had discussed with him the apparent hopelessness of fighting the steamship combine.

Appalling Situation. Mr. Preston declared that he had found a most appalling condition existing in the ocean freight rates and the combine must be crushed even if 20 or 30 vessels had to be subsidised.
