A LONG SLIDE :- The North-western Lumberman says that Hopkins and Irvin have a log slide in Green township, Pa., that they have operated for two seasons and that it is five miles long. It is con-structed, by laying two logs side by side and hewing out a groove in which the logs slide. The mode of operation is to roll the logs into the slide and draw them along with horses, something after the style of a canal boat. When the slide is a down grade no horses are needed, the long train of logs flying down at a fearful rate, making the woods ring when the ends bump together, and occasionally jumping the track where there is a shor The slide terminates at a point on turn. the headwaters of the west branch of the Susquehanna river, whore it has deposited 5,000,000 ft. of logs this season.
