DISSEMINATION OF SEED GRAIN AND POTATOES

Dominion Experimental Farms will Send Out Best Sorts of Grain and Potatoes to the Farmers.

By instructions of the Hon. Minister of Agriculture a distribution of superior sorts of grain and potatoes will be made during the coming winter and spring to Canadian farmers. The samples for general distribution will consist of spring wheat (5 lbs.), white oats (4 lbs.), barley (5 lbs.), and field peas (5 lbs.). These will be sent out from Ottawa. A distribution of potatoes (in 3 lb. samples) will be carried on from several of the experimental farms, the Central Farm at Ottawa supplying only the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec. All samples will be sent free, by mail.

Applicants must give particulars in regard to the soil on their farms, and some account of their experience with such kinds of grain (or potatoes) as they have grown, so that a promising sort for their conditions may be selected.

Each application must be separate and must be signed by the applicant. Only one sample of grain and one of potatoes can be sent to each farm. Applications on any kind of printed form cannot be accepted. If two or more samples are asked for in the same letter only one will be sent.

As the supply of seed is limited, farmers are advised to apply early; but the applications must not necessarily be filled in the exact order in which they are received. Preference will always be given to the most thoughtful and explicit requests. Applications received after the end of January will probably be too late.

All applications for grain (and applications for potatoes) should be addressed to the Dominion Cereals, Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa. Such applications require no postage. If otherwise addressed delay and disappointment may occur.

Applications for potatoes, from farmers in any other province should be addressed (postage prepaid) to the Superintendent of the nearest Branch Experimental Farm in that province. J. H. GRISDALE, Director, Dominion Experimental Farms.

City Council Decides To Ask Discussion of West Side Proposals

Commissioners Pass Resolution Requesting Board of Trade to Call Meeting of Citizens to Discuss Dock Question—Would Assist Minister of Public Works to Expedite Work.

At the special meeting of the city council yesterday it was decided to ask the Board of Trade to call a public meeting of citizens to discuss the question of the length of the West Side docks, in order that the Minister of Public Works might speedily implement his promise to build the revetment wall and another pier on the West Side. A contract was let for a new warehouse on the Pettinill wharf.

On motion of the Commissioner of Finance it was decided to appoint John O. Porter as a city constable. The Mayor recommended that the city take half a page of advertising in the souvenir to be issued next year in connection with the convention of the Trades and Labor Congress. On motion of Com. McLellan, the recommendation was adopted.

West Side Improvements. The Mayor referred to the visit of Hon. Robert Rogers, and the resolutions presented to him by the Board of Trade. He pointed out that two of the resolutions presented to Mr. Rogers stood out prominently; these were the resolutions referring to the building of the 400 ft. neutral strip, in regard to the agreement entered into between the city, the government and the C. P. R., the Minister of Public Works had strongly approved the clause providing for the reservation of a 400 ft. neutral strip, allowing any railway access to the government docks on the West Side.

The Mayor said that when the agreement was made with the government and the C. P. R., in reference to the 400 ft. strip, it was the intention that the business on the harbor front should be handled, as in Montreal, by a harbor commission.

Com. Schofield: "Conditions here are not quite the same as in Montreal." Finally it was decided to ask for an expression of opinion from the citizens, the Board of Trade to take the lead in calling a meeting.

Com. Agar brought up the matter of purchasing 4 lots on Kennedy street at \$200 a lot. He thought it was advisable for the city to purchase as there was a lot of rock there suitable for street work. When the rock was cleared off the lots would be worth more than \$200 a piece. The property is now owned by Mr. Lipsett. It would be a good place for a portable stone crusher to work.

It was decided to purchase the lots. Com. McLellan said he had looked into the matter of installing four fixture lamps in front of the market on Charlotte street, and estimated the cost would be \$125 a lamp. The commissioner was authorized to put up the lamps and charge the cost to the market account.

Com. McLellan said that he expected the revenues from market tolls this year would be \$1,000 or \$1,200 in excess of last year.

Com. Schofield stated that the agreement allowing Charles A. Emery to take stone from Brooks ward had become void.

An order was passed to pay the annual membership fee of \$150 to the Union of Canadian Municipalities.

Tender Accepted. Mayor Prime recommended the acceptance of the tender of H. B. Whitehead to erect the new warehouse on the Pettinill wharf property. His bid was \$3,251. The specification call for the construction of the building in two months. Com. McLellan said the warehouse should be finished within a month.

Com. Schofield: Has the question of making this a frost-proof warehouse been considered? The Mayor: No. If any company wants it as a frost-proof warehouse arrangements may be made.

Com. McLellan suggested that the city try to get Mr. Whitehead to undertake to finish the warehouse within 5 weeks.

The Mayor said the warehouse would be about 100 feet square, and would be for the use of the Red Cross Line or any other concern. He was surprised that the engineer had allowed two months to complete the work.

On motion of Com. Schofield, it was decided to accept Mr. Whitehead's tender, it being the lowest. The council then went into committee of the whole to discuss the matter of building a retaining wall on Acadia street, and it was decided not to build the wall till spring.

Council then met and adopted the report of the committee of the whole, and adjourned.

SAFE DEFIES ALL EFFORTS

Huge Vault, with \$1,000,000 in Bonds Inside, Refuses to Open—Contract of Sale Broken.

London, Nov. 18.—With over \$1,000,000 city bonds, delivery of which was contracted for last Saturday and with several dollars in cash locked away in its innermost recesses the huge five-ton safe in the office of the city treasurer has defied the efforts of Treasurer Bell, his assistants and a corps of locksmiths to open. For four days a gang of men from the works of the manufacturers have been drilling the burglar proof doors. Sixteen drills have been broken in an effort to open the safe and it still defies the efforts of the mechanics to open.

It was Saturday morning when the combinations of the safe went wrong. Over \$1,000,000 in City of London bonds, purchased by a Toronto bond house, were locked in an inner drawer. The contract for their sale called for delivery Saturday afternoon; naturally this Saturday has not been fulfilled. Saturday and Sunday expert locksmiths attempted to get the "tumblers to work right" without avail. As a last resort the manufacturers were wired and yesterday afternoon a gang of men from the safe works arrived with the necessary drills and tackle.
