Hish grade industrials were responsive to trade advices, which offered more encouragement. An early break of twenty points in Bethlehem Steel common, with ten for the preferred, was soon rectified, though both issues closed at net declines. United States Steel and kindred shares were two to three points higher at their best, with seven for Gulf States Steel. The shorts were again impelled to cover in the motor issues on further gains in Maxwell's, General Motors, and Studebaker, while subsidiary stocks, including the rubber group, were firm to strong on reports of a gigantic consolidation.
