

### FORTUNES MADE

**IN PEACE TIME**  
Birmingham to be Busy for  
Years to Come—Money for  
All  
("Daily Express" Special Correspond-  
ent)  
During the war Birmingham made  
munitions and money from patriotic  
motives. Now munitions have stopped,  
but not the money.  
Everything that is solid, from dolls' eyes  
to ships' anchors, is manufactured  
in the Midlands capital, but the Bir-  
mingham fortunes. The clearances  
from the Birmingham banks from the  
beginning of this year to date total-  
led just over £122,000,000. For the same  
period of last year the clearances  
were £115,750,000 a nice increase.  
During the single week ending on  
November 30 the cheque clearances  
were over £2,350,000, as against £2,  
000,000 for the corresponding week of  
1915, proportionally a still nicer and  
more substantial increase.
