SMUGGLING OF LIQUOR TO STATES GROWING DAILY

Washington, Feb. 2—Secretary
Glass today asked Congress for \$2-
600,000 for use in stopping the smug-
gling of liquor into the United States.
A statement from the division of cus-
toms accompanying the request said
that, because of meagre facilities for
dealing with the situation, "the quan-
tity of liquor seized was infinite in
comparison with the quantity actual-
ly smuggled into the country."
Steps planned by the Customs Ser-
vice to prevent the smuggling of con-
traband liquor include the reorganiza-
tion of a big staff of mounted inspec-
tors to patrol the Canadian border.
