Says He Will Send
Car Owner To Jail

Federicton, N. B., June 29.—Declaring that there was no provision in the motor vehicle law under which he would take away a man's license to drive his own automobile in New Brunswick, Judge Lamerick this morning announced his intention of sending a local man who had been convicted of operating his car while drunk, to jail for a term which would determine later.
The man had had an exciting week end. On Sunday afternoon he was being driven to his boarding house by a friend when he suddenly reached over the seat and struck a fire hydrant near City Hall, unloading a flood of water. The next day he took another friend out for a drive and wound up by going over the river bank at Manserville. That night he remained yesterday afternoon with the case uncompleted until this morning. The judge declared that he would not allow the accused out of custody because he might go out in his car and kill somebody.
