Lumber and Other Statistics Show Prosperity in North Shore Town.

Campbellton, Jan. 15.—The fire of 1910 focused the eyes of the whole country upon Campbellton, which in the language of the despatches to the papers at that time, was wiped off the map.

THE WOMAN'S CORNER EFFICIENT HOUSEKEEPING

When and How to Disinfect.

Every board of health issues pamphlets filled with practical suggestions for disinfecting that are most valuable. There is no charge for these directions and it is the business of every housekeeper to familiarize herself with this essential knowledge.

Sulphur is one of the most powerful fumigants and gives very good results. When this is used the fumes will destroy all life so that houses infested with insects, rodents and disease germs are made clean.

For disinfecting sewers, soil, etc., dissolve a pound of copperas in a gallon of water and apply by flushing. Copperas is poison. For washing bed linen that has been about contagious illnesses, make a solution of two tablespoons of salt, four ounces of sulphate of zinc and a gallon of water.

While the cake is in the oven, open and shut the door carefully. A sudden jar often causes a cake to fall. For the same reason avoid turning the cake during baking. If turned at all, it should be after the mixture has become thoroughly set.
