How Water Freezes.

It used to puzzle all thinking people why ponds and rivers do not
freeze beyond a certain depth. This
depends on a most curious fact—
namely, that water is at its heaviest
when it reaches 40 degrees F.— that
is, 8 degrees above freezing point.
On a frosty night as each top layer
of water falls to 40 degrees it sinks
to the bottom; therefore the whole
pond has to drop to 40 degrees before any of it can freeze.

At last it is all cooled to this
point, and then ice begins to form.
But ice is a very bad conductor of
heat. Therefore it shuts off the
freezing air from the big body of
comparatively warm water underneath. The thicker it gets the more
perfectly does it act as a greatoat,
and that is why even the Arctic
ocean never freezes beyond a few
feet in thickness.—Marine Journal.
