Two New Post Offices to be Established Immediately.

The residents along the Gros Ventre Creek have at last been successful in securing two new post offices. One of these has been situated for four years, but nothing definite was done until last week, when John Hatson signed the contract for carrying the mail. As soon as the contract is returned from Ottawa, the service will commence. Mail will come in on Friday and go out on Saturday.

City Looking after Cattle.

Prominent Stock Men Interview Mayor—Cattle Being Fed and Looked After by City.

The severe weather has driven a number of the range cattle into town, and the poundkeeper was unable to cope with the situation as it was felt the conditions called for. Accordingly, A. P. Day, W. B. Marshall, P. Robertson, and A. J. Day visited the mayor, and asked that something be done to see that these cattle did not starve. Mr. McMullin, stock inspector of the city, had kindly offered the use of the C.P.R. yards for the housing of the cattle, and it was suggested that the offer be accepted.

As the feeding would have been difficult under these circumstances, and as the protection would not be the best there, it was decided by the Mayor that Mr. Farwell should be appointed to round them up and feed them at 50c a day apiece.

A notification appears elsewhere in this paper to all owners of these cattle that they will be charged what it costs the city, and must remove the cattle immediately, as the feed will not hold out much longer.

A steer from Maple Creek drifted into the city the other day, and the owner, upon being communicated with, asked that it be sold.

The New Publicity Commissioner.

Chances Good for Securing an Excellent Man.

The Board of Trade Council is making an effort to secure one of the best men in Canada for the position of publicity commissioner. Several telegrams and letters have passed between them and C. P. R. Freight Expenses of Delegates at J. T. Hall, of Hamilton, who has done so much for that city. A large salary has been offered, and Hall was asked to telegraph his answer. Here it is: "Favorably impressed. Letter with particulars will go forward at once." Mr. Hall would be invaluable, as he would come with information that could be turned to immediate use. Calgary and Winnipeg were after him, but as both these cities have chosen their men, he was open to give a decided answer.

In the correspondence the complaint of Mr. W. H. Tom regarding a bad ditch and culvert in front of his house was referred to the engineer. Shields requested for an additional \$500 interest on the money owing to the market site was again referred to the city solicitor.

Dr. Smyth's bill for attending two men injured on the city work was ordered paid as the men were treated at their houses, instead of at the hospital.

The Provincial Government and W. Symonds, bridge foreman, asked for 5 cent gas for the bridge camp. This was referred to the gas commissioners.

The Department of Agriculture reminded the council of the appointment of a health officer.

Messrs. Kealy, Crawford and Foster asked that the street running through the hospital property should be closed as it was never used, and would be more convenient for the hospital. It was decided to take the necessary steps towards this end.

The special committee appointed for this purpose reported in favor of separating the offices of sec. treas. and clerk with a salary of \$1100 to the former and \$900 to the latter. The former price was raised to \$1200. These two men are to take over the work of the secretary treasurer of the school board.

The planing and flour mills are to pay \$15.00 a year for their gas.

A most remarkable example of how close profits are cut was in the tenders for the lumber for the sewer outlet. Finlay & Co. tendered \$48.00, Revelstoke Lumber Co. \$68.00, and the Medicine Hat Lumber Co. \$68.90. It is supposed that a silver more was on the latter two than on the former. It was so clearly a case of "pulling the wool" that the tender that was the lowest tender that they got it.

The Council decided to buy the engineers instruments to the value of \$200.

The license and police commissioners reported 19 arrests for December, and receipts of \$891. Another constable was recommended and the chief is to secure one.

It was decided to send Mr. Porter to Toronto to buy a meter testing machine and to study up the repairing of meters, etc. Mr. Driman suggested the procuring of a practical gas man as there is too much work for one man. Later it carried to have the engineer report on his ideas of the division of labor. The mayor wanted to wait until the meter tester arrived, and then, if necessary, to send Porter east.

Ald. Penhale reported several changes in the fire mail, including the shifting of the sliding pole, iron bars in top half of stall doors, two stalls planked, etc.

Ald. Hutchinson announced the sale of the old engine and boiler at the pumping station for \$250.

F. W. Brown applied for the position of auditor. The matter was postponed until the next meeting.

Farwell's offer of 90 cents a trip for looking after the ambulance was accepted over Mack Hydon's for \$90 a month and \$1.50 a trip. The ambulance is to be insured.

Dr. Boyd was unanimously appointed health officer for this year.

A short report was given by the mayor regarding the Red Deer trip and Ald. Penhale gave a feeling address of thanks to the delegates for their report.

The fire, water and light committee are to look after a new ladder for the fire hall. Also a new chemical engine, and the cost of a hose reel and shed for the north side of the track.

The Mayor's action in seeing to the feeding of the range cattle on the streets was approved. Ald. Hunt refused point blank to pay the 50 cents would leave his cattle in the yards where they are being kept. Sixty nine cattle are there.

New Settlers for Bowell.

The Rush to Start for Medicine Hat District.

Last week a visitor to the city was C. B. Pearson, of Melbourne, Iowa. Mr. Pearson's visit was a matter of some consequence to Medicine Hat and the surrounding country, especially around Bowell.

The Pearson-Marshall syndicate owned about twenty sections of land all within 8 miles of Bowell, and have been selling it to intending settlers. Already a great part of it is disposed of, and several families of farmers will move in the spring. Mr. Pearson has been sending the Times to these families and the place is not unknown to them.

Last February he purchased this land, and at that time Medicine Hat wasn't much of a place on the map to them.
